Objectives and investment policy

The sub-fund's objective is to seek regular, above-average income. Under normal circumstances, the sub-fund invests mainly in bonds and bond market instruments that meet strict ethical and financial criteria. The sub-fund may also invest in other securities permitted by UCITS regulations. The sub-fund may use investment techniques and derivatives for efficient portfolio management (including hedging). The sub-fund is managed at the fund manager's discretion without reference to any benchmark. The manager uses its own analysis to identify those individual bonds that can offer the best overall combination of price, risk, income and also meet established ethical standards. The sub-fund considers sustainability risks into its investment decision making process. The investment universe is determined initially using a negative screening process followed by a positive screening, provided by a specialist ethical investment unit, Rathbone Greenbank Investments.

The investment universe is further determined by using information provided by the companies (for example company website and sustainability reports) and third-party data such as MSCI.

The Manager applies a range of techniques to select appropriate investments:

Issuers must satisfy at least one of the following: strong employment practices, sustainable environmental practices or community engagement and commitment to human rights.

Excluded companies are from the following industries:

- Alcohol manufacturing
- Human rights abuses
- Poor employment practices
- Animal welfare violations
- Pornography
- Gambling
- Carbon-intensive industries
- Alcohol retail
- Nuclear power
- Polluting the environment
- Armaments
- Tobacco manufacturing

Designed for: Investors who understand the sub-fund risks, want an investment that focuses on capital growth, and intend to invest their money for at least five years.

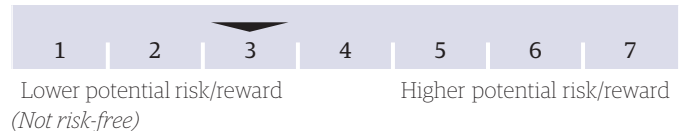
You can buy and sell units on each business day of the sub-fund between 9am and 5pm Luxembourg time.

Bonds: Securities that represent an obligation to repay a debt, along with interest.

Derivatives: Financial instruments whose value is linked to one or more rates, indices, share prices or other values.

Hedging: Using techniques to partially cancel out risks.

Risk and reward profile

The risk indicator for this sub-fund reflects the following:

- The emphasis on income helps the manager to maintain a moderate risk profile for the sub-fund.
- As this share class is less than five years old, the indicator is not based solely on actual performance for the class.

Counterparty risk: The sub-fund could lose money if an entity with which it does business becomes unwilling or unable to honour its obligations to the sub-fund.

Currency risk: Changes in currency exchange rates could adversely affect sub-fund performance.

Default risk: The issuers of certain bonds could become unable to make payments on their bonds.

Liquidity risk: During difficult market conditions, some securities may become hard to value or sell at a desired price.

Management risk: Investment management techniques that have worked well in normal market conditions could prove ineffective or detrimental in extreme market conditions.

Sustainability risk: Is an environmental or social event that could cause a material fall in value of the sub-fund.

The charges shown below are based on actual fees and expenses for the rolling year ending 31 January 2022. The ongoing charges figure has been capped at launch.

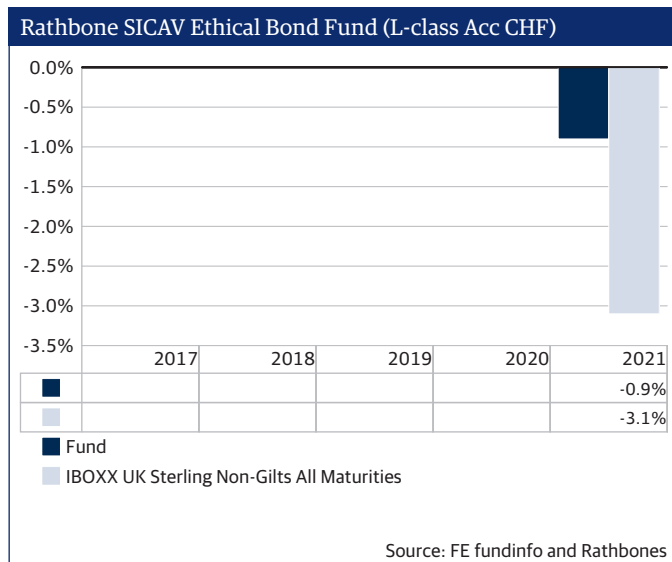
